THE EFFECTS OF POOR ECONOMY ON DEATH RATES

Economics

Scholars have stated that there is a significant relationship between low standard of living that results from low income; and increased mortality rates. A low standard of living is more likely to result in malnutrition, which can make people more susceptible to disease and more likely to die from these diseases. A lower standard of living may lead to a lack of hygiene and sanitation, increased exposure to and the spread of disease, and a lack of access to proper medical care and facilities. Poor health can in turn contribute to low and reduced income which can create a loop known as the health-poverty trap.[24] Indian economist and philosopher Amartya Sen has stated that mortality rate can serve as an indicator of economic success and failure.[25][26]:27

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Historically, mortality rates have been adversely affected by short term price increases. Studies have shown that mortality rates increase at a rate concurrent with increases in food prices. These effects have a greater impact on vulnerable, lower-income populations than they do on populations with a higher standard of living.[26]:35–36, 70

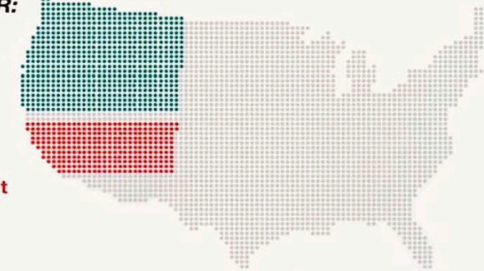
